Annual Review by Dr. B. P. Adhikari, Director:

Mr. President, Mr. Chairman, Professor Ramalingaswami, distinguished guests, candidates receiving degrees and diplomas, students and colleagues of the scientific disciplines and the administration, I have great pleasure in presenting to you in the following pages a brief review of the activities of the Institute since the last convocation in April 1980.

From this review and a perusal of the more detailed Annual Report it will be seen that this has been a year of consolidation of the academic activities. As far as teaching is concerned, I may recall that, following the introduction of the f0+2 school system in the country, the Institute had converted the four-year B.Stat. degree programme into a three-year programme in 1978-79. The third year of this new programme will end in May 1981, and hence a new two year M.Stat. programme has just been adopted by the Academic Council and the Council of the Institute to be effective from July 1981.

Research and consultancy activities have proceeded vigorously. Apart from the stable lines of activity, in which significant contributions have been made by the staff and research scholars in statistics, mathematics and other disciplines, an enlargement in collaborative work has been made, particularly between statisticians and scientists of other disciplines. May I only present in brief some fields of research which have been undertaken either in collaboration with scientific institutions outside or financed by different funding organisations. For several years now, a comprehensive antropological and human genetical work on several endogamous groups of India is going on in collaboration between our antropologists and a team of the Institute of Ethnography of the Academy of Sciences of USSR. The first volume of a joint publication in the Russian language has appeared, and the second volume has also most probably appeared by now. Editing of the third volume is in progress. The Soviet team will visit India again during the coming winter for further field work. This continuing and painstaking work is not only providing a wealth of information on social and physical characteristics of endogamous groups, it is also leading to a mass of data which will be amendable to interesting statistical analysis and conclusions, besides the statistical analysis which is being presented in the current series of publications.

The second continuing work of collaboration is in the field of linguities, with the Institute for Experimental Phonetics and Pathology of Belgrade, through repeated visits of Professor Djordje Kostie. As you know, through this effort not only have advanced methods of speech correction for hearing-impaired children been introduced in India, publications on the phonetic structure of several Indian languages have been made. This work also has produced a mass of data for interesting statistical analysis. Among the outside funded schemes are the following. An ILO funded village survey is well under way for the last two years. More recently, a research scheme has been undertaken on microprocessor based continuous patient monitoring systems, financed by the Electronics Commission. The ICMR has agreed to finance a study on some immunological problems in connection with Malaria, which has just been started. At the initiative of the FAO, a socio-economic survey of coastal fishermen of West Bengal is going to be undertaken by the Institute, to help in the development of small-scale fisheries of the Bay of Bengal.

The Institute attains fifty years of age in December 1981 and the Council has decided to celebrate its Golden Jubilee mainly through the organisation of scientific conferences over a period of about three months in fields in which the Institute has a record of sustained work and recognised contributions. Much work has been done in

this matter and four conferences have been announced. The first and innagural conference is proposed to be held at the end of December at Calcutta to review the Indian planning process. The second conference, being argnised jointly with the International Federation of Information Processing, will be held at Bangalore during the first and second weeks of January 1982, on the theory and applications of random fields. A third conference, entitled Statistics: applications and new directions, will be held at Calcutta during the third week of January 1982. A fourth conference on human genetics and adaptability, scheduled for the first week of February 1982 at Calcutta, is being organised in collaboration with the Indian Society of Human Genetics and the International Association of Human Biologists. Two other conferences, one in the era of electronics and information sciences and the other in operations research, are under preparation. There is every likelihood of wide national and international participation in these conferences. Steps towards the details of the successful organisation of these conferences are being taken.

Among the conferences organised by the Institute last year, may I only mention one in honour of Dr. C. R. Rao, to felicitate him on attaining sixty years of age. This conference on Probability and Statistics was held at Delhi from 8 to 13 December 1980, in which Dr. Rao participated and which was attended by a large number of participants not only from all the centres of active statistical research in India, but also from Czeckoslovakia, Democratic Republic of Germany, Japan and the U.S.A.

In the last year's review I had spoken of the need of augumented physical facilities in the Institute, particularly construction both for office and residence. At the Bangalore Centre the basic work to start construction has been done and we hope to begin actual construction soon. In Calcutta, the fifth and sixth floors of the composite library building are under construction and, when completed, will relieve us of our space requirements to some extent for scientific activities. We are almost certain of making a beginning in the construction of residential quarters for low paid workers during the coming financial year, but the scale is yet negligible compared to the needs. We are still uncertain about a hostel building for senior and international students, an administrative block, an auditorium and a canteen building. It needs to be emphasised above everything that if any institution located in a big city in India wishes to attract good scientists and preserve an all-India character of its faculty, it must be able to provide residential accommodation to them. Today it is not so much the salary offered as the impossible situation regarding rented apartments which has become a deterrent to the recruitment of good scientists. As in the Institute, many other all-India institutions are in a situation where they fail to make recruitment for this reason in the back- ground of Government's declared policy of renewed support to science and technology, it is hoved that the problem of housing will be given proper attention. It is admitted that the Government is perforce having to operate under constrained resources, but a doubt sometimes appears in the mind whether resources are always the true constraint.

One surprising casewhere a beneficial decision is not taken even with the possibility of a reduced outlay is the proposed introduction of the Pension-cum-General

Provident Fund-cum Gratuity schome in the Institute Instead of the prevalent contributory Provident Fund-cum-Gratuity scheme. The former scheme is practised in all Central Universities and the Institute of Technology, Besides, its introduction in the Institute will mean a reduced outly from the Government from its present rates of contribution towards the retirement benefits of employees of the Institute. It is therefore a matter of surprise to us why Government is delaying its approval to the scheme. Let us hoos that this will come soon.

One major gain in the matter of physical facilities is the acquisition by the Institute of a special electric power connection which will not be interrupted during periods of load shedding. Due to prolonged cuts in power supply our activities related to the computer, the scientific laboratories and the press suffer u great deal. We are grateful to the Chief Minister of West Bengal to have granted us the benefit of an uniterrupted power line which is in the final stages of being connected.

In conclusion, may I gratefully express my thanks to Shri Subimal Dntt, President of the Institute, and Shri P. N. Hakser, Chairman of the Institute, for their kind readiness to provide wisdom and counsel. I thank all our colleagues at different levels of scientific and administrative functions for their cooperation. I must also thank the ISI Workers' Organisation for its concern over the development and smooth functioning of the Institute and the rationality of its approach even in complex issues, which facilities the working of the Institute.

AUDITORS' REPORT

We report that we have audited the attached Balance Sheets as at 31st March, 1981 signed by us under reference to this report, of

- (a) Indian Statistical Institute and
- (b) Other Funds

and the annexed Income and Expanditure Accounts for the year ended on that date with the books and records maintained by the Institute and produced to us and information and explanations given and read with the notes appearing thereon and subject to notes nos. 1 (fixed assets), 3 (merger of funds and adjustment of Arrear Claims), 6 (Loans and Advances), 7 (Additional D. A. Deposit with Regional Provident Fund Commissioner), 11 (for Books & Journals), 19 (regrouping of previous year's figures) of Schedules IX and read with other notes of the said Schedule and also subject to the remarks given below, have found them to be in accordance therewith.

The remarks referred to above are :

- 1. Though National Sample Survey Unit has been separated from the Institute with effect from 1st June, 1972, the consequential changes with regard to Assets and Liabilities taken over by them, have not taken place in the accounts as yet. As such, balance sheet as at 31st March, 1981 of the Indian Statistical Institute and Income & Expenditure Account for year ended on that date do not give a true and fair view to the extent of this unworked out position.
 - 2. Security Deposit :- Rs. 78,356.57 (Dr.)

Receipts of deposits and or confirmation letters could not be produced for our verification except for deposits of Rs. 36, 897.41.

- In the absence of confirmatory letters, the balances in the following accounts remained unverified (a) Loans and Advances (b) Deposits & other Liabilities.
- For the purpose of Income and Expenditure Account, the allocations of expenses between plan & non-plan as made by the Institute have been accepted by us.
 - 5. General observation :-

(a) In our opinion the institute should have an internal audit system and the internal control system should be streamlined.

- (b) Institute's revised final budget was approved by "Section 8(1) Committee" with certain modification. Actual non-plan expenditure compares (avourable with such budget estimates whereas actual plan expenditure was short by Rs. 13.61 lakhs (approx.) when compared with budget estimates.
 - (c) The book-keeping offers scope for improvement.

1. Fixed Assets .

(a) Value of fixed assets acquired on dates prior to 31st March, 1952 was taken from the inventory prepared as on that date. Registers for fixed assets are being maintained showing inter-alia, the written down value of the assets as on 31st March, 1976 as the original cost of the assets. No physical verification of Fixed Assets was carried out during the year 1980.81. However, the Management of the Institute is contemplating to take up the physical verification of red assets phasewise completing the verification onever a number of years. In respect of obsolete and discarded assets a committee was set up for their recommendation for write off action and their report has been submitted but pending further sertules, the matter is under active consideration of the Council.

In accordance with the terms and conditions of the grants for Capital Expenditure received from the Government of India. It he Institute shall not sell or other wise dispose off or mortgage any property acquired by it with such grants without prior approval of the Government. Most of the assets have been acquired out of the Government grants, total written down value of which, however, are not secretainable.

In respect of assets acquired under deferred payment scheme, liability for unpaid amount has not been accounted for although depreciation on such assets has been calculated on full value of such assets. This is as get the practice followed by the Institute.

- (a) The Institute is holding land and landed properties acquired Inhough Government or by direct purchase. In case of acquired land/landed property, the Institute has been given certificates/grant of possession and in other cases instruments of transfer have been executed by the sellers and the donors. In respect of 4 Bats purchased from West Bengal Housing Board, the conveyance deed was revisered on 2.14 8.8
- (c) Electronic Computer at Baranagar—Cost of a generator with installation charges is included in the above account. The generator is exclusively used for running this computer.
- (d) As per the practice followed by the Institute, depreciation of fixed assets is charged in account from the year following the year of addition of such assets.
- (e) 95 % of the expenditures on Books and Journals (including cost of binding etc.) has been capitalised by crediting general fund as per past practice.
- (f) No physical verification of Library Books was conducted during the year. Discrepancies found on physical verification of Library Books in Delhi in earlier years are under scrutiny.
- (e) Ooe shed under item no. C. I.2 is under the process of dismanting on 31.3.1981. The Salvaged materials are being used in the construction of certain structures at 36, Bidwayatan Sarani, Calcutta under progress on 31.3.1981 wide item no. C. I.2. Necessary adjustment of value on both accounts will be considered when dismantling is complete and on the basis of valuation of total salvaged materials obtained, used and disposed off.

Investment including those under different funds stand in the name of Indian Statistical Institute, Securities ear-marked for the specific funds have been disclosed in the balance sheet of the respective funds.

- 3. Amount claimed to be claimed from Government of India-Rs. 77,53,177.80.
- Consequent upon the decision of the Council in their meeting dated 29th September 1981 based on the recommendations of the Arrear Claim Committee and approval of Ministry of Planging.

- (b) Out of the total arrear claim of Re. 77.53.177.80, on amount of Rs. 39.54,000.00 was admitted by the Government (out of which Rs. 4.50.000/- was already received by the institute and credit was one given to Claim Account and the effect is merged in Exercis of Receipt over Expenditure Non-plan Revenue Account) and the amount has been adjusted with the unspent grants appearing under the hards: —
 - (i) Not Excess of Receipts over Expenditure in respect of Non-plan Revenue upto 31.3.81 amounting to Rs. 12.09.096.56.

- (b) Concerned departments have been advised to determine the obsolete/damaged stores and building materials but no report has so far been received.
- 6. Loans & Advances Rs. 43,14,454.46.

(a) Separate tedgers/registers are maintained for House Building Loan. Flood Relief Loan, Festival Advance, Travelling Advance, Co stage Load to 1818. Advance to Suppliers/Contracters and L.T.C. Advance. No provisions in respect of old outstanding advances are made in the casts of workers of the Institute since they are fully realised at the time of final settlement, i.e., as the time of resignation, extrement and death, of their accounts. Unless the nature of works differs or exigency exists second T.A.L.T.C. advances etc, are not paid unless the previous advance is adjusted or under dispute. Various accounts under above heads consist of old balances over oneyer and in some cases over three years. Necessary scrutiny and linking up is under process. Subsidiary register balances in respect of L.T.C. Flood and Staff Advance are under reconciliation with main Redger accounts.

Advance to suppliers/contractors includes Rs. 12,213,56 is recoverable from Bharat Overseas (P) Ltd., Delhi. The Institute has fixed a suit for recovery of the amount which is pending before the Court. As the Institute has no system of making provision against Doublful Debts/Advances, any amount becoming finally irrecoverable will be adjusted in the year it becomes actually bad.

Physical verification of stationeries, stores etc. is being made to ascertain abnormal loss, if any, opening and closing storks of these materials are not considered to find out the revenue impact over the year as per usage of the Institute's accounts. Similarly, opening and closing seeds stocks at Giridih are also not exhibited in the account.
 - 14. (a) Grants-in-aid includes Rs. 7,50,000/- for the year 1980-81 received after 31,3.81.
 - (b) Repair cost includes Rs. 274.35 recoverable from a party.
- 15. Medical reimbursement expenses includes Hospital Advances paid by the Institute. Incomplete bills entered in the record of MERU have not been considered in the accounts.
- 16. Imposition of liquidated damage clause for non-completion of the construction jobs by the contractors within the stipulated time is usually considered at the time of final payment.
